## Sutherland Viaduct and Pedestrian Overpass Offer Safe Access

Sutherland's new viaduct on Nebraska Highway 25 has been completed and is carrying traffic. The new viaduct spans both U.S. Highway 30 and the Union Pacific Railroad tracks. In addition to the new two-lane viaduct, an adjacent pedestrian overpass that spans the railway tracks is nearly completed.

"The pedestrian overpass is one of the first of its kind in western Nebraska," according to NDOR Project Manager Rich Morrell, of North Platte. "This walkway presented several design issues that were addressed during construction. Modifications have been made to future projects with similar walkways based on the changes necessary to this walkway."

Morrell said the pedestrian overpass is in compliance

with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements, and will be fully lighted upon completion. The walkway is located on the west side of the old Highway 25 railroad crossing, and cost \$916,000.

The viaduct eliminates any delays for traffic and emergency service vehicles due to blocked crossings. The walkway provides safe pedestrian passage over the railroad tracks. Two at-grade railroad crossings were closed as a result of this project. A ribbon cutting was held for the new viaduct on August 29. There is some work yet to be done on the walkway.

TransSYSTEMS Corporation of Omaha designed the pedestrian overpass. Sam Fallaha, Design Section Leader in NDOR's Bridge Division, designed the viaduct. The prime contractor for this project was Capital Contractors, Inc. of Lincoln, at a cost of \$4,410,332. Chuck Kedlecek was the project supervisor for Capital Contractors.

NDOR inspectors for this project were Construction Tech 2 Doug Gertsch and Construction Tech I Darrell O'Neal. Congressman Tom Osborne was instrumental in obtaining \$2 million in federal funds for this project.

## **Engineering Pool Program Emphasizes Field Experience**

Discussions among management at NDOR's central headquarters and in the districts regarding work force development have often revolved around a common dilemma: how to attract and retain more field engineers. According to John Jacobsen, NDOR Deputy Director of Operations, the new Engineering Pool Program is designed to gradually turn this situation around.


Jacobsen said the Engineering Pool Program, implemented in June, evolved after almost three years of brainstorming, discussions and planning on how to meet the need for engineers with field experience. He noted that the District Engineers deserve the credit for the initial idea, and together with the Division Heads the final plan was developed.

District Engineers developed a twoyear field-training program designed to expose new engineers to the major activities associated with highway construction, including preliminary surveying, construction surveying and construction inspection. According to Jacobsen, this exposure will provide experience and knowledge that are desirable for advancement within the department.

The efforts of Sue Larson, Human Resources Division Administrator, were integral to the process, as it was necessary to create a pool of vacancies in the field for program participants.



Initially, a pool of six positions was created, with positions contributed by the districts and divisions. According to Larson, this process was completed without creating any new full-time equivalent (FTE) positions.

The six positions are currently located in Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4. To ensure fairness, Larson said pool applicants were asked to name their top three choices of districts. The person who scored highest in the interview was given the first selection, the second highest received the next selection, and the process continued until all positions were filled.

After completing the two-year program, participants may select a district or division they choose to relocate to and every effort will be made to meet their request. To accomplish this, Larson said a system was developed in which a position that moved to a district or division after the two-year program completion would be paid back to the pool from that division or district the next time a vacancy became available.

Both Jacobsen and Larson emphasized the Engineering Pool Program would not have been possible without great cooperation from NDOR divisions and districts in donating positions to this pool. They agreed it was a team effort and a "win-win" situation for everyone.

While it is still too early to tell, Jacobsen is optimistic that the program will generate more engineers with valuable field experience. He noted, "The bottom line is to give these engineers the field experience that will help them in their careers."

If the pool program proves successful, Jacobsen said he would like to add two more positions. He would also like to see the program expand into Districts 5, 6, 7 and 8. Since recruiting efforts aren't confined to Nebraska, he noted some of these districts might be attractive to potential applicants in surrounding states.

While participants have been in their respective districts for a short time, several supervisors already had highly favorable comments about their pool participants and about the program.

District 3 Engineer Kris Winter said their pool engineer, Kris Fornoff, "has exceeded our expectations by leaps and bounds." Winter said Fornoff has already been assigned a small county bridge project to gain project management experience, which usually comes after about two years of experience in the field.

District 4's assessment of pool engineer Alan Swanson was also very good. Assistant Construction Engineer Dennis Heermann said their district believes the NDOR Engineering Pool Program is beneficial and they hope it continues. He said, "We feel it is good people management to have entry-level engineers in the field performing hands-on duties. This type of experience can only benefit all parties involved."

All of the pool participants say they have learned a lot and are enjoying their experience in the field. Alan Swanson noted, "With every new day, experiences in the field (both good and bad) are helping me in my present and future career as an engineer." Niki Figard of District 1 said, "I like the challenge of learning the construction aspects of transportation engineering." Kris Fornoff commented, "Overall the Engineering Pool Program serves to give the engineer a more complete understanding of road and bridge construction from start to finish... the process is very rewarding."



## NDOR Wins AASHTO Photo Contest Honors

The Nebraska Department of Roads received a second place award in the inaugural AASHTO "Faces of Transportation" photography contest. The theme for the contest was safety. NDOR received a congratulatory letter from John Horsley, AASHTO's Executive Director, and a check for \$500.

The photo, taken by NDOR photographer Jay Bailey, shows a passenger on a Lincoln StarTran handi-van route being assisted by a StarTran driver, who is securing her wheelchair to the floor. According to Horsley, the photo of the transit rider has drawn many complimentary remarks while on display in the AASHTO offices in Washington, D.C.

Horsley noted, "It exemplifies the hard work—and the human element—in transportation... We were delighted to have such a fine and creative entry to bestow with an award in this contest." ◆

## NDOR Receives Interstate 80 Environmental Review Award

The Nebraska Department of Roads was recently recognized by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for their efforts in completing a successful environmental review of a 35-mile stretch of the Interstate 80 corridor from the Platte River to just west of Lincoln.

A plaque was presented to Representative Doug Bereuter at a ceremony in Washington, D.C., and local FHWA officials presented the plaque to NDOR Director John Craig and Deputy Directors Monty Fredrickson and John Jacobsen at central headquarters in Lincoln.

According to Cindy Veys, Environmental Section Manager for the Planning and Project Development Division at NDOR, the environmental review came about after several important steps were taken that helped prevent delays on the six-lane expansion of the roadway, while ensuring environmental protections.

On September 18, 2002, President George W. Bush signed an Executive Order to enhance environmental stewardship and streamline the decision-making process in connection with major transportation projects. As a result, a Cabinet-level task force was formed to ensure projects were not unnecessarily held up by inefficient review procedures. Governor Mike Johanns nominated Nebraska's I-80 project, which was one of 70 transportation construction projects nominated for the expedited environmental review by governors from around the country.

Veys said the I-80 project was nominated primarily because of its regional and national importance as a key link in the national interstate transportation network, as well as the need to overcome the effect of project

delays that occurred during the development of the project. These delays were related to the I-80 project's effects on a rare saline wetland in northern Lancaster County. The project also crosses the Platte River, which has been designated by federal wildlife officials as a critical habitat for the endangered piping plover.

Veys said NDOR has worked closely on the project with several agency partners, including the FHWA, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGPC), the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ), in attempts to streamline environmental reviews.

On February 27, 2003, it was announced that the Nebraska I-80 project was one of six projects named to the project priority list, bringing the total number of selected projects to 13.

According to Veys, designating this I-80 corridor helped ensure environ-

mental concerns surrounding the project would be addressed in an expedited manner, minimizing costly delays.

"Once the nomination was selected, these actions helped bring together agencies with a resolve and a focus to complete the environmental review document," Veys said.

Deputy Director Monty Fredrickson recognized efforts of NDOR employees who contributed to the document's completion at the Ouarterly Rewards and Recognition Ceremonies on October 31. ## Lewis & Clark Survey Markers Installed at Fort Atkinson


On September 19, Deputy State Surveyor Gene Thomsen and fellow members of the Professional Surveyors Association of Nebraska placed two Lewis and Clark Memorial survey markers at Fort Atkinson, Nebraska. They placed a 12-inch and a 4-inch brass cap replica of the Lewis and Clark peace medal.

Thomsen said the 12-inch cap was established along a walkway leading to life-size bronze statues, which represents the first meetings with Lewis and Clark and the Native American Indian leaders from the Otoe and Missouria tribes. The 4-inch cap was placed at the location of the control point that was used for the archeological digs and improvements at Fort Atkinson. It is located about 600 feet southeast of the large cap.

According to Thomsen, 12-inch diameter holes were drilled and filled with concrete for both caps, 51 inches deep for the 12-inch cap and 53 inches deep for the 4-inch cap. Forms were

set for a 3-foot by 4-foot concrete slab, which was poured around the large cap and will provide a place for a future memorial plaque. Thomsen said he plans to use a Global Positioning System (GPS) to locate the points of the two caps, and he will place the latitude and longitude on the plaque, as well as the number of miles west and north from the origin of the Corps of Discovery, which is Thomas Jefferson's home, Monticello.

Next year, the commemorative survey markers will be dedicated at the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial "Signature Event," which will be held July 31-August 3. The "Signature Event" will feature

#### GIS Day Activities Showcase Real-World Technology

On November 17, the GIS Section of the Information Systems Division sponsored activities in the NDOR central headquarters auditorium, with the goal of assisting employees in making better decisions with current data in an easy-to-use format. GIS applications showcased during the open house included:

- NECTAR (Nebraska Enterprise Centerline Transportation Attribute Resources – A GIS intranet decision support tool, which allows the user to query multiple databases and map the results.
- Digilog web-based photos of the highway system.
- MapPublisher software used to publish the State Highway Map.
- MADDOG (Menu Aided Display of Digital Maps or GIS Products) A Visual Basic program that displays various maps produced by the GIS Section.
- IHI (Integrated Highway Inventory) database of roadway classifications, locations, characteristics and project history plus the Nebraska Highway Reference Post Logbook.
- NATPS (Nebraska Automated Truck Permitting System).
- **HDM** (Hydrology Data Management) hydrology information of bridge projects and links to bridge clearance information.
- Database for Environmental Studies Demonstration of threatened and endangered species, soils, wetlands and other environmental layers.
- Traffic Modeling GIS database foundation for the statewide traffic model.

### State Road Crews Leverage Technology to Wrestle Winter Weather

When winter weather sweeps through Nebraska, the Department of Roads' snow removal fleet stands ready to meet the challenge. With a combination of high-tech and traditional tools at their disposal, the department continues to build upon the latest innovations to lessen winter's blast.

This is the third year Nebraska's statewide 511-telephone system is available to provide 24-hour-a-day, year-round traveler information. By dialing 511 on their cellular telephone or landline telephone, motorists will be able to access the quickest, most up-to-date information about weather conditions, road conditions and travel advisories. Callers outside of Nebraska may dial 800-906-9069. The 511 system is also available on the Internet at www.nebraskatransportation.org.

New this year, automatic speech recognition (ASR) was activated September 23. Callers now have the option of using their voice or keypad to make selections while using 511. For example, a report can be requested for Interstate 80 by saying "Interstate 80" or by entering the number and the "#" sign. With this feature, callers can use the latest technology to help them reach their destination safely.

Nebraska's 511 system provides information for Nebraska and South Dakota highways. Phone numbers are provided for accessing Wyoming, Colorado and Iowa traveler information.

Remote weather information system (RWIS) towers are located along roadways throughout the state. Instruments on the towers collect valuable information, including wind speed, temperature, humidity, barometric pressure, precipitation, pavement and subsurface pavement conditions. This information is relayed by telephone line to NDOR maintenance crew computers about every 30 minutes during winter. Crews

are able to respond more quickly with de-icing materials as well as tailor the applications to the conditions of the road, enhancing safety and efficiency.

De-icing systems are in place on bridges in several districts, including District 4 (Grand Island), District 5 (Scottsbluff) and District 6 (North Platte). Because of the ability to pre-treat the pavement, these bridge de-icing systems have proven helpful in preventing accidents and are especially effective for frost conditions.

The department plans continued use of liquid chemical processes for frost, ice and snow control on roadways. Maintenance crews will use several liquid chemicals on the roadways, including salt brine and agricultural-based products mixed with magnesium chloride. These products prevent snow and ice from bonding to the pavement surface, or they may be applied as de-icing materials to help remove ice and snow buildup on the roadway.

Some districts plan to expand their anti-icing/de-icing operations in selected areas. According to Chris Ford, District Maintenance Superintendent for District 5 (Scottsbluff), "Our district had excellent results with use of salt brine last winter and we are looking forward to expanding the program." Ford noted that brine trucks would be located in several new areas this winter. District 5 also plans to meet salt storage needs with the addition of a temporary salt storage building at Chadron.

Again this year, changeable message signs will be positioned along Interstate 80 from Kimball to Omaha and on other highways throughout Nebraska, alerting motorists of immediate and/or upcoming closures.

Nine new dynamic message signs (DMS) will be placed at locations along the Interstate 80 corridor throughout central and western Nebraska to assist motorists. The electronic message signs are constructed over the Interstates and notify drivers of construction, lane and road closures, accidents and

inclement weather. Signs are also part of the Amber Alert system. Last year, DMS were installed at nine locations on the Interstate system in the Omaha metro area. Six additional signs are planned for the Omaha area within the next two years.

Real-time weather and road information is available on the Roads Department website, <a href="www.nebraska">www.nebraska</a> <a href="www.nebraska">transportation.org</a> by clicking on the "511" icon at the bottom of the home page. Various weather links are also available on the website by clicking on the heading "Road Reports & Travel Info." Information about 511 can also be obtained by clicking on <a href="www.safetravelusa.com">www.safetravelusa.com</a>.

Travelers are reminded to follow basic rules of the road for winter driving conditions, including making sure their vehicle is tuned up, traveling at reduced speeds, leaving extra space between vehicles and always buckling up. When planning a trip, travelers are advised to check the weather forecast for their planned destination. Remember: "If the snow is blowing, should you be going?" ◆

#### McCord Receives Humanitarian Award

Karen McCord, Highway Contracts Technician II in NDOR's Construction Division, received the Humanitarian Award at the quarterly Rewards and Recognition Ceremony held October 31 at NDOR's central headquarters in Lincoln. McCord was honored for her assistance to a friend who had collapsed in her home and was semi-conscious due to an obstructed airway.
